

Gubbins family Notes.

According to the Rev George Gough Gubbins who wrote the "Memoirs of the Gubbins Family" and published it in 1891, the first Gubbins to appear in Ireland was a certain Capt. Gubbins, a Cromwellian officer who married a Miss Carpenter. Captain Gubbins got land near Bruree but he and his wife returned to England leaving his Estate to his two sons, Joseph and James.

Joseph got Lackanagrour, Kilbreedy, Dromacommer and Cloonbrien. James got the lands and castle of Knocklong. Joseph leased the lands of Clogher which lay nearby, from John Ormsby of Athlacca and lived out his adult life there with his wife and family of two sons and four daughters. (Memorial 64000 names five sons and two daughters). I have given the modern spelling of these five Townlands and they all lie in a semi-circle West, North and East of Bruree, Co. Limerick.

Knocklong and Kilfrush lie 15 Kilometres East of Bruree with Hospital/Kenmare Castle directly North of Kilfrush.

Joseph's first wife was Margaret Croker but she died early in their marriage. Joseph married again to Catherine Blakeney.

The Gubbins family, named in G O 253 (see page 2) fit the family of Joseph of Clogher above, with James omitted because he had the Knocklong Estate. Joseph from G O 253, could be the Joseph junior who was given Kilbreedy Townland by his father, if so then his wife was Martha Collis. Joseph of Kilbreedy and Martha, his wife, are both named in the Blennerhassett Pedigrees written by Black Jack Blennerhassett in 1733, no children were mentioned so they were probably newlyweds.

It was the Knocklong family who acquired Kilfrush and continued the Gubbins line down to the 20th century. From Kilfrush they moved into Maidstown and then into Hospital/Kenmare Castle. James, his son James and his son Joseph stayed for about 50 years in Maidstown before Joseph's son George moved to Newlawn and renamed it by its old name, Uregare House. In 1768 Gubbins of Maidstown held the lease for Lackanagrour, one of the earliest Townlands held by the Gubbins.

It should be pointed out that all Lands belonged to the Crown and that the King or Queen of England granted large tracts of lands to their favourites and supporters in return for military service. This Military service was translated into cash payments during times of peace. The Dukes and Earls likewise granted smaller portions of their lands to their relatives and followers who in turn leased or rented smaller pieces of land to farmers and cottiers. It is wrong to speak or write of families "Owning" land when they only held it by lease from some other bigger family who in turn held it from the Crown.

Here Lieth the body of James Gubbins who departed this life xber the 26, 1738 aged 33 years. The Stone was erected by his daughter Catherine. (xber stands for October, the tenth month. Therefore James was born circa 1705 and probably married circa 1726. Catherine would have been aged about 11 years old when James died so the Tombstone was erected years after his death).

The Kenmare Mss. P 173 and 174.

The Tythe account book for the year 1722 lists James Gobbons (sic) paying tythes in the three Parishes of Kilfrush, Doon & Long and Knocklong. The 1728 tythes were paid by Joseph Gubbins in the parish of Kilfrush while Mr William Gubbins paid tythes in the parish of Doon & Long.

Note: - Betham left a question mark against the wife of Peter Sargent but her name was Elizabeth Gubbins.

Peter Sargent was born in 1711 and married Elizabeth in 1731. He was Mayor of Limerick in 1753 and died in 1785. (See Sargent file). The Webb family lived in Maidstown Castle in the early 1700's but sold it to the Gubbins family around 1750. Joseph Gubbins sold the lease to James Creed in 1793.

From Maidstown the Gubbins moved to Newlawn, also known as Uregare House.

I would surmise that the Catherine who married Mr Bennet was a generation younger than the Catherine who erected the memorial to her father James.

This records the Marriage Settlement between Joseph Gubbins of Kilfrush and Mary, the daughter of George Stamer of Carnelly. (Carnelly is in Co. Clare).

(These two were the parents of George Stamer Gubbins, Born 14/01/1769, married 05/10/1790, Died 11/04/1797. He married Anne Russell who was born 21/12/1770).

Memorial 278153, Marriage Settlement, dated 27 August 1790.

From this Marriage settlement for the marriage of Elizabeth Ann Carr, daughter of the Rev Ralph Carr of Bath and step daughter of Mary Stamer his third wife, to Chidley Coote of Ash Hill, Kilmallock but then of Bath. (We note the presence of George Stamer Gubbins the son and heir of Joseph Gubbins, deceased, the former husband of Mary Stamer. He was probably there to prevent the transfer of any of the jointure of Mary Stamer to Elizabeth Ann in the settlement. Mary's Jointure would revert to George Stamer Gubbins when Mary died and was not Mary's or her husband's to give away as part of the dowry of Elizabeth Ann).

(Ralph Carr's second wife died on the 09/09/1786 so his marriage to Mary Stamer was after that date but before 1790. Mary Stamer eventually died in 1813. Ralph Carr died in 1810, aged 73).

Memorial 303015, dated 2 Nov 1793.

This deed shows Joseph Gubbins of Maidstowen selling the lease of Maidstowen and other lands to James Creed in 1793.

(See Creed file where James Creed and his son were living in Maidstowen in 1803).

Capt John Minnit of Knygh Castle married Mary Gubbins in 1713. She was the daughter of Joseph Gubbins of Kilfrush who died in January 1737 and Grand-daughter of Joseph Gubbins of Knocklong.

Limerick Archives.

Deed number D0321. Dated 1721.

This Indenture is a Marriage Settlement for a wedding that occurred in 1720. A sum of £500 was involved. This must be the Bride's dowry. The persons named are: -

James Gubbins of the 1st Part,

Christopher Carr, the 1712 Sheriff of Limerick City of the 2nd Part.

Christopher Carr, Junior, the Groom. (Referred to as Christopher Carr Christopher in other Records, i.e. Christopher Carr son of Christopher Carr. The last Christopher is not a surname but has been used, too often, as such by compilers of indices).

Elizabeth Gubbins, the Bride, daughter of James Gubbins of the 3rd Part.

Joseph Gubbins of Clogher of the 4th Part. (This proves that Joseph was alive in 1720).

Limerick Freeholders who voted. 1760

William Gubbins, Burgess. (Sheriff of Limerick City in 1758).

Limerick Archives. Corporation Payment Records.

William died in Aug 1767 and his widow Ann was already drawing the pension of a Burgess's widow in that year according to available records. Ann died in 1795 and a Margaret Gubbins was paid her arrears of pension as Ann's heiress. This indicates that William had no living sons when Ann died. **William** Gubbins was Sheriff of Limerick City in 1758. From then on he would be a Burgess. He would have also have been in line to become Mayor of Limerick but he died too soon in 1767. **William** had a daughter Margaret who died on the North Strand at an advanced age on Saturday 13 May 1837. Margaret was obviously born before 1767 so she would have been aged 70 plus when she died in 1837. We can see from the Freeman List that William had a brother called Joseph Gubbins. Bartholomew was most likely another brother.

Robert seems to have grown up in Duggan's Row. Then he got a Flat or Room for himself in John's Square and moved to Brennan's Row when he married Alice. Robert died at Brennan's Row in March 1964, Alice having died 10 years earlier in 1954.

It is possible that 30 Beaumont Road, which is given as Robert Gubbins address when he died, should read 30 Brennan's Row?

A check in the original Register shows that this was a transcription error and that it should indeed read 30 Brennan's Row.

It would appear very certain that Alice was Robert's wife's name and that their infant son Robert died shortly after birth in 1907.

Helen Gubbins of 1901 became Helena by 1911 and was known as Lena when she died in 1949.

James Gubbins who gave his age as 56 in the 1901 Census and whose age was given as 70 when he was buried in 1911 must have been at least 21 when he was admitted a Freeman in 1858. Therefore he was born sometime between 1833 and 1837.

Calendar of Wills and Administrations. 1944.

Michael Gubbins died on the 10/03/1944, of St. Ita's Street, Limerick. His effects amounted to £871-1-9 and administration was granted to Robert Gubbins a retired Railway worker. (His brother).

1949.

Helena Gubbins, Spinster died on the 13/09/1949 at 15 St. Ita's Street, St Mary's Park. Her effects were valued at £1506-10-9.

(The 1788 Trade Directory confirms her as Margaret Gubbins, Milliner of Mary St. Most likely the daughter of Sheriff **William** Gubbins who died in 1767. Anne Gubbins his widow died in 1795 and **William's** 2nd daughter, Anne died at Camas in 1819. Margaret died an old woman in 1837).

The 1769 Trade Directory names a Joseph Gubbins, a Mercer, i.e. a Merchant, running his business from the Main Guard which was in Mary St., in the same location as Margaret Gubbins the Milliner. If Joseph is the same person that was admitted a Freeman in 1762 then he would be Margaret's uncle.

A John Gubbins, Shoe and Bootmaker operated from Mary St., in the 1788 Trade Directory and was still there in 1824. This is most likely the John who lost his son Edmond, aged 19 years, in 1801 and who lost another 5 year old son in 1803 and who died himself in 1833.

James Gubbins, Shoe and Bootmaker, was listed in the Trade Directories in High St. in 1838 and in William St in 1840 and 1846. He died in 1848. His daughter Hannah died in 1852 and his wife Mary died in 1857. James Gubbins is listed in Griffith's Valuation at 34 Lower William St. in 1850. Facing up William St from O'Connell St. on the right hand side, the houses are numbered 1 to 37. 37 being on the corner of William St and Wickham St. So 34 is the 4th house back from Wickham St. corner. The Clinic of Alternative Medicine occupies the site today. (2014).

William Gough Gubbins appears in the 1856 Trade Directory as a Provision Merchant at Tanyard Lane, Upper William St. although his home was at Lisnagry. In 1867 his home was at Woodstown, Lisnagry. He was still there in 1870 but had moved to Castletroy by 1871. However he died in Castleconnell in 1902. His 1st wife Mary Gubbins nee Russell died in 1874. His 2nd wife was called Isabella and in the 1901 Census he was living again in Castleconnell.

There was a Catholic Gubbins family who lived and died in Castle St., Nenagh, Co. Tipperary even though the head of the family was born in Limerick and was buried with most of his family in Mount Saint Laurence cemetery in Limerick City. The seven family members were buried across Plots Xb 208, 209 and 210.

Joseph and his two wives are buried in Plot Xb 209. Catherine, his first wife, was buried on the 05/01/1881. Joseph who died on the 29/06/1903 was buried on the 02/07/1903, aged 60 years and Marianne his 2nd wife who died on the 23rd at 96 Leeson St., Dublin was buried on the 25/06/1912. She was the Mary Anne Hanly who married Joseph on the 14/11/1883 at Nenagh. A Michael Gubbins of Castle St. was buried on the 07/03/1904 aged 30 years. He was also a son of Joseph's. *Admin was granted to Patrick J. Gubbins of both Joseph's will and Marianne's will.*

Plot Xb 208 holds the remains of Patrick Gubbins who was buried aged 7 years on the 07/10/1929. He died at Cabra, Co. Dublin. Here also lie the remains of Mary Gubbins, a single woman who died at Milford Nursing Home on the 03/05/1951, aged 70 years. She

could be Joseph's daughter who is given in the 1911 Census as Patrick's sister. Patrick being Joseph's son and heir. Patrick, in the 1911 Census referred to Marianne as his step-mother.

Plot Xb 210 holds a Bridget Gubbins of Nenagh, no age given, who was buried on the 20/01/1878. She was the first Gubbins of Nenagh to die but no age was recorded so her link to Joseph cannot be established.

Patrick Gubbins, Joseph's son and heir was born in 1872 and married an Anne O'Connor in 1913. He was still living in 1936.

There is another Catholic, Gubbins family who can be traced in the Census, the Mount Saint Laurence Burial Register and the 1912 Limerick City Postal Directory. They were the family of Patrick Gubbins, a School Teacher and his wife who was also a School Teacher. Patrick and his family were buried in Plot Fc 91.

Patrick was born circa 1847 and his future wife Anne Geary was born circa 1850. Patrick, a Teacher, was named in the 1879 Trade Directory living in Clare St. His Address is given as 47 Clare St. in 1886 and 1891. He died on the 4th and was buried on the 07/08/1907 with an address of 49 Clare St. Patrick and Anne buried their three year old daughter Mary on the 10/02/1889. They buried their 7 year old daughter Anne on the 31/05/1896 from 49 Clare St. Patrick's son and heir, James A. Gubbins is listed for 49 Clare St in the 1912 Postal Directory an essential tool in fixing correct house numbers for any person living in Limerick especially numbers given in the Census which cannot be taken as accurate house numbers.

1st Class House. 10 Rooms. 6 Windows to front. The Gubbins shared the house with a Mary Maher, aged 60 who occupied 4 of the 10 Rooms.

When Anne Gubbins died she was living at 21 Catherine St. She was buried on the 18/02/1939 aged 89. So far there is no record of what became of her two living daughters, Catherine and Alice.

James A. Gubbins of Castleconnell was buried on the 11/07/1983 in Plot Fc 90. His age was not given but if he was the son of Patrick and Anne then he was circa 91 years old. A Rachel Gubbins, aged 66, was buried in the same plot on the 25/11/1963. She was living on the South Circular Rd. when she died.

William Gough Gubbins appears in the 1856 Trade Directory as a Provision Merchant at Tanyard Lane, Upper William St. although his home was at Lisnagry. In 1867 his home was at Woodstown, Lisnagry. He was still there in 1870 but had moved to Castletroy by 1871 when his widowed daughter Mary came back to live with her parents. However he died in Castleconnell in 1902. His 1st wife Mary Gubbins nee Russell died in 1874. His 2nd wife was called Isabella and in the 1901 Census he was living again in Castleconnell. Eleanor Russell Gough – Gubbins was born circa 1854 and married circa 1877.

Caleb Powell formed a Grand Jury in 1858 and penned fairly offensive comments about his fellow Jurors. Here is what he wrote about William Gough Gubbins. “ *William G. Gubbins married a daughter (very ugly) of a provision merchant who realised a good fortune in Limerick. His brother James Gubbins, a neighbour of mine asked to place his brother Wm. on the Grand Jury as it would give him a lift and he had acquired some land in Limerick, I complied thinking the pork pickler would match the tea dealer*”. (Mary Russell must have been the “very ugly daughter” referred to by Powell.

William succeeded the Gough family in Woodsdown in 1853. He later sold Woodsdown in 1875 for £3000. William’s brother James was of Lismullane.

Gubbins of Cush, Kilfinane, Co. Limerick A Catholic family.

Griffiths Valuation, 1852.

James Gubbins held 130 acres from Lord Lisle in Cush Townland, Emlygrennan Parish, Coshlea Barony. The House was rated at £9-10-0.

Joseph Gubbins, a farmer, of Grange, Co. Limerick died on the 12/08/1879. Administration of his will was granted to his father James Gubbins of Cush, Co. Limerick.

His effects were valued at under £600.

James Gubbins a Gentleman Farmer of Cush, Kilfinane, Co. Limerick died on the 24-08-1880. Probate to Rev Timothy Gubbins of Inchicore, Co. Dublin. His effects were valued at under £600.

Her effects were worth £5152-1-0.

William R. Gubbins, a Farmer, of Cush, Kilfinane, Co. Limerick died on the 09/12/1937. Probate was granted to William Robert Gubbins, Farmer. Effects were worth £2663-6-9.

Calendar of Wills and Administrations. 1942.

Mary Teresa Gubbins, Spinster, of Cush, Kilfinane died on the 18/11/1942. Administration of her will was granted to William R. Gubbins, Gent. Her Effects were worth £3249-11-2.
