



John Vincent was appointed Chamberlain on the 27th Dec. 1740. His salary as Chamberlain was £45 per annum. He was still in Office in 1761 when a Parliamentary committee pronounced him "a confused witness in a bad state of health." He was an opium user. This is most likely the John Vincent, Burgess, whose will was proved in 1766.






Quay Lane Site.

On the 5th April 1711, Alderman John Vincent was granted a lease of a site which he already had possession of as the assignee of Zachariah Holland who had been leased the site in 1692. Vincent's lease was for 51 years at a rent of £1-8-0 per annum. The rent for this site was £60 in arrears in 1745. The site was described as: -

"All that the waste plot of ground lying on the south side of the Tholsel in Quay Lane, then in the possession of John Vincent by lease thereof set in 1692 to Zachariah Holland and assigned to said John Vincent, and which were then a garden and stable and waste plot at the West end thereof containing 18ft in or within the whole length, next to the house then in possession of [] which is excepted out of the lease to Zachariah Holland". Alderman John Vincent left this site to his son Thomas Vincent, Burgess, in his will and the Corporation renewed the lease to Thomas on the 25 Sept. 1736, for 99 years at a rent of £1-8-0. It was beside the house then in the possession of Edward Morony which had formerly been in the possession of the widow Burton.

West Watergate Site. (Mardyke)

On the 19 March 1715 Alderman John Vincent was granted a lease of the lands of Bowerkeogh, Bowerard and Travator totalling 3 acres for 999years at a rent of £3. It was formerly held by Dermicius Coghlan (the Rent receiver for the Corporation) It was bounded on the West and North by the river Shannon and is therefore the area on which the New Custom House was later built. See Map. The rent for this site was paid up to date in the 1745 Rent Roll.

Limerick Archives, L/OC/4/1. A letter to the Corporation dated 10 Feb. 1796 states that this site had been transferred by John to his son Richard who had transferred it to his son John Vincent, Burgess, in Sept. 1758. He, on his death, bequeathed it to his son Richard whose title was sold by the Sheriffs and purchased by Thomas Smyth. The heirs of Richard Vincent have instituted an action for the recovery of these premises.

Whoever wrote this letter seems to have got his facts mixed up as the proper descent was from John 1 to his son John 2 and from John 2 to his brother Richard who sold the site to his nephew John 3, who willed it to his son Lt. Berkley Vincent. Berkley sold out to Philip Roche [fitz] John

The new lease written on the 5 Sept. 1758 gives John Vincent and his heirs the right to charge Quayage on the merchants using the docks quays and Custom House.
