

What age was Simon when he died, young, middle aged or was he old? If a husband and wife die around the same time it should indicate the deaths of two mature adults. From the Abstract it would seem as though Simon's sisters Catherine and Elinor were still alive when he wrote his will. Both of them must have been mature adults as well. So Mrs Catherine Vokes nee Evans should appear in the death notices anywhere between 1722 and say, 1742. Now it would appear that Catherine Evans married one of the very first Vokes mentioned in my research, when the Vokes all seem to have lived in St. Munchin's Parish in Limerick City.





(John 2 died on the 22 Nov 1781 aged 98 so he was born circa 1683. Note: - George Vokes is of the same generation. There was a George Vokes of Cragbeg who died in 1771. There was also a Thomas Vokes, Merchant of Limerick, who died in 1785.)

This stone has been erected as the last tribute of affection and respect to the memory of Sam Evans of Mallow St. and formerly of Southill in the city of Limerick who died on the 27th of April 1854 aged 73 years by his sorrowing widow A. Evans. As a tribute of effection by her bereaved mother to the memory of Elizabeth Esther, youngest and beloved daughter of the late Samuel Evans of Southill. She fell asleep in Jesus on the 9th Feb 1860 aged 22 years. To the memory of Deborah the beloved child of S. and A. Evans of Mallow St., who died 11th March 1848 aged 29 years.

Sacred to the memory of Lt. Thomas Evans, 38th Regt. who died 16th Feb. 1861 aged 68 years.

Local Studies. Obits from Limerick Chronicle.

The death of Ann, the widow of Samuel Evans, aged 73, was reported on the 11/2/1868. She lived at 12 Mallow St and was a daughter of the late John Cannon of Galway. (She and Samuel married on the 27th March 1811)

In the **1815 Rates Book** there is a Mr Evans living at 13 George St. That would have been in the middle of the block now occupied by Brown-Thomas's stores. Number 22 was the Club House. Another Mr Evans lived at No. 45 George St. and a Francis Evans lived in Mallow St. The Rates Book for 1815 covers St. Michael's Parish only.
