Plea For Clemency
The public mind of Ireland is but slowly recovering from the stunning blow of horror inflicted upon it by the insurrection which broke out in Dublin on Easter Monday. That wholly insensate enterprise had in it every element of sadness and tragedy, and there is no man of the Irish race who would not be capable of realizing facts but who cannot comprehend with vehemence the "mad campaign," as the Most Rev. Dr. Keble, Bishop of Ross, aptly described it. The solitary redeeming feature in connection with the whole uprising is that the outbreak was the work of a small minority, most of whom were themselves mere innocents, if well-meaning, dupes of others, and that it is denounced by none more loudly or more vigorously than by the vast overwhelming majority of the Irish people themselves both at home and abroad. The actions of public bodies and Nationalist organizations all over Ireland, as well as the numerous resolutions passed by the Irish people themselves, are all in unison in their condemnation of the insurrection and in their plea for clemency to the insurgents.
