LIMERICK CATTLE MARKET.

WEEKLY MARKET, SATURDAY, MAY 17th.

Dairy cows and incalf heifers—
 102 cows and heifers on offer, a
 surprisingly heavy entry for this
 time of the year; slightly more cows
 than heifers, trade for the latter
 being particularly good. Buyers
 were again in strong and represen-
 tative attendance. The quality of
 the cows and heifers in addition to
 the quantity has been improving
 consistently at this market for some
 time past. The top prices obtained
 to-day were the best this season,
 the bidding for the choice cows and
 heifers, of which there were many
 on offer, being particularly good. A
 heavy turnover and a remarkably
 good clearance, in view of the heavy
 entry, was effected. Top price for
 calved cows went to Mr. John A.
 Moran, Ballyhaunis, Co. Mayo, at
 £45 10s., the runner-up being Mr.
 John Joyce, Towlerton, Ballysimon,
 at £43. While top price for incalf
 heifers went to Mr. Weekes, Lime-
 rick, at £43 for a heifer which
 attracted many buyers and very
 keen competition. Last week a
 feature of the market was the fact
 that 26 cows and heifers sold at £30
 and over. At to-day's market this
 figure was exceeded when 29 cows
 and heifers were sold at £30 and
 over. Incalf and calved cows, best,
 £36 10s. to £45 10s.; seconds, £32 to
 £35; others, £24 10s. to £30; small,
 £18 to £22. Incalf and calved heifers,
 best, £35 to £43; seconds, £30 to
 £32 10s.; others, £24 15s. to £28 10s.;
 small, £14 10s. to £22 10s.
