SHOCKING ACCIDENT IN CITY

A shocking accident occurred at the Sawmills of Messrs. Francis Spaight & Sons, Dock Road, Limerick, yesterday, resulting in the death of one man and injuring of others.

The dead man is James Downey, 47 Sexton Street, Thomondgate. He was aged about 45 years, was married and had one child.

The tragedy was caused when a boiler burst, the deceased being severely burned by flying sprays of what might be described as burning lava.

A second workman, Edward Brennan, 5 Park View Terrace, was also badly burned and scalded. Other employees sustained less severe injuries when attempting to rescue the deceased and his companion.

It was learned that the deceased man was blown into a corner when a plate in the boiler burst, was trapped in a shower of scalding spray and was unable to move while his fellow-workers looked on helplessly.

Others made attempts to get to him but the deceased, despite his great pain, kept shouting to them to remain at a distance. It was some minutes before two workers were able to creep along the floor underneath the jet of scalding water and rescue him. By this time he was very badly scalded and evidently in great pain. With his fellow-workman, Edward Brennan, he was rushed to Barrington's Hospital in the Corporation Ambulance. Two hours later Mr. Downey died, having been fortified by the rites of the Church.

It was learned to-day that the condition of the second man is much improved.

The inquest touching the death of James Downey will be held on Friday at 4 p.m.
