MARTIAL LAW
QUESTION BY MR. DILLON
MR. ASQUITH'S REPLY
In the House of Commons last evening,
Mr. Dillon asked the Prime Minister whether
he intended to bring forward a Bill to amend
the Statute of 1849, which gave the Lord
Justices of Ireland the power to suspend
the application of Martial Law to the whole
of Ireland for an indefinite period; whether he
had approved of this Statute; and if not,
what grounds he justified the application of
Martial Law after all disturbances had come
to an end, and whether he considered
the issue of such a Statute calculated to
promote an atmosphere favourable to a settle-
ment of the Irish difficulty, by general good
will and consent.

Mr. Asquith said in his statement last
Thursday that Martial Law is being continued
for the time as a precautionary measure, and
he hoped its disappearance would be speedy and
complete. In the meantime it will not be re-
sorted to except in case of urgent necessity,
and with the minimum of inconvenience to the
civilian population.
