## MURDER CHARGE

### ACCUSED AGAIN REMANDED

At to-day's sitting of the Lime-  
 rick District Court, James Kennedy,  
 of 44 Sexton Street North, Thomond-  
 gate, was again formally charged  
 with the wilful murder of Thomas  
 Fahy, who was found lying dead  
 near a pool of blood in the bar of  
 his licensed premises at Mungret  
 Street, Limerick, on the night of  
 June 17th last.

Supt. P. Colleran sought a fur-  
 ther remand in custody for a week,  
 mentioning that inquiries were still  
 in progress.

Mr. M. B. O'Malley, solr., who is  
 appearing for the accused, asked  
 the Superintendent when he thought  
 he could arrange for the taking of  
 depositions.

The Superintendent replied that  
 he had just submitted his file on  
 the case to the Attorney-General.  
 He felt sure everything would be in  
 order at the next sitting of the  
 Court, and that a date could then  
 be fixed for the taking of deposi-  
 tions.

The Justice mentioned that, in  
 view of the list for his area during  
 the coming week, it would be one  
 of the most difficult, in which the  
 case against Kennedy could be  
 heard.

The Superintendent pointed out  
 that he would not be ready to pro-  
 ceed during the coming week. It  
 was his intention to have a date  
 fixed on Friday next for the begin-  
 ning of the taking of depositions  
 during the following week.

The Justice, mentioning that he  
 could sit on the Monday following  
 the next sitting of the Court, re-  
 maned Kennedy in custody for a  
 further week.
