## BRUFF JULY FAIR

Though Bruff July fair, held last week, was of rather small dimensions, business generally was brisk, particularly for heavy bullocks (finished beef). A fairly large attendance of buyers resulted in a good clearance at satisfactory prices.

Prices were:—Three year old bullocks (beef), £32 to £38; two year old bullocks, £22 to £30; fat heifers, from £26 to £33. Yearling heifers and bullocks met a rather quiet trade, heifers realising from £14 to £18 10s., and yearling bullocks making from £12 to £18. Good fresh young cows met a good trade and realised from £26 to £33; older cows were in quiet demand and realised from £6 to £16. Springing heifers were in good demand at prices ranging from £24 to £33. Heavy bulls met a fair trade from 40/- to 45/- per cwt. (live weight).

There was a good demand for bonhams, despite a scarcity of feeding stuffs, and prices ranged from £4 to £6 each.
