September 2nd, Fitt & Co. held a sale of lambs and ewes. This annual sale has become one of the best held at the weather conditions. Entry, 1,826, comprising ewes, fat rams, showed a decrease on last year, being the largest, a percentage of merit. Generally all of the entries were of a useful description, and nicely brought up to the standard and the standard favourably with last year's brisk enquiry and all classes of lambs and Suffolks came in in strong numbers in strong competition. Ewes met with a good exchange. Small lots also changed hands at high rates. Top price for a pen of Martin O'Brien, Cappamore, for a pen of 10, the runner-up being O'Halloran, Rhine, 1 Down at £7 12s. 6d., 130/- to 162/-; second, 127/-; small, 72/6 to 80/-; entry of breeding sheep. In this section also firm demand. Active enquiry and demand was not slack. Top price went to a pair, Bride Street, 4s., for two pens of Mr. Jos. O'Malley, obtained £7 4s. for a pair of maiden ewes, being Mr. Michael O'Brien, at £7 3s. 6d., best, 130/- to 150/-; substantial entry, in the form of pens of well bred sheep, for which there was a good demand and firm; the well fed hoggets and ewes showed a strong and steady demand but for secondary demand was somewhat slack. Young ewes also showed a good demand. Mr. Martin O'Brien, Cappamore, for the section topped the list with a pair of cross-bred hoggets at £9 15s., being Drombanna, being £9 6s., closely followed by Jno. Farrell (Pat), Cappamore, at £9 2s. Fat rams, best, 160/- to 195/-; small, hoggets, best, 175/- to 185/-; run, 155/- to 171/-; second, 150/-; ewes, best, 155/- to 170/-; run, 122/- to 144/-.

Department showed an increase on last year, and comprised Suffolks and ordinary Suffolks was strong demand for useful lamb rams, and drew sharp competition, particularly for Oxford Downs. Top price for a pair of Suffolk ram to Mr. J. J. Smith, Blackwell, at 15½ gns., age of 14½ gns. The runner-up being Conheady, Knockmarkon-Fergus, at 14 gns. Mr. E.
