CLAIMS OF IRELAND
REGARDING MUNITIONS
WORK
Requests of Recent Deputation

Satisfactory Letter to Mr. Redmond

The following letter has been received by Mr. Redmond in reference to the deputation from the All-Ireland Munitions Committee, which was introduced on October 16th. I am glad to be able to tell you that I see my way to make arrangements which I hope will meet practically all their requests. (1) Surplus Boxes. We are prepared to accept, at contract prices such quantities as are in the hands of the present holders of the Ministry of Munitions and the firms concerned. (2) Future Box Contracts. Tenders will be invited in Ireland for 100,000 S. A. 100-lb. boxes for delivery over the three months November, December and January, and also for 300,000 15-pounder boxes of the new design, deliveries to commence at the end of January, the whole to be delivered within three months. Further Irish firms will be invited to tender for such miscellaneous boxes, including those that are still in the hands of the Ministry of Munitions, as may be required in the future. This requirement varies greatly from time to time, and consequently it is not possible to give any definite statement as to the number required. (3) Lee Arrow. Manufacturing Co.—I understand that a satisfactory arrangement was concluded with these contractors at the Conference, so I need not say any more upon that point. (4) I think I said at the Conference, I am in entire sympathy with the desire of this district to undertake munition work, but, as I explained, the limiting factor is the difficulty of obtaining machinery, and this is not lessened by the request that such machinery should be of a nature capable of adaptation to machine-repairing work after the war. The whole of the district is now engaged in the question of the question, but I have been reported to me this week that we are in a position to secure the plant of a contractor closing down, which would be capable of manufacturing from 700 to 1,000 15-pounder shells per week, and if this proposal is acceptable to the All-Ireland Committee I am prepared to give that machinery will effectively deal with the Lee Arrow. I shall be glad if you will ask the Committee to take the matter up further with Captain Deane and let us have their decision. (5) There are all the points which I think were raised at the Conference, and you will see that I have done my best to meet you on them all. There is another point, which was not mentioned, on which we are also able to make some concessions in order to meet the wishes of Irish firms. They have complained from time to time that there have been delays in payments for goods which they had made, and I am glad to say these delays are not always our fault, but in order to minimize them in future the representatives of the Ministry of Munitions in Ireland will be empowered to make payments in respect of duly authenticated accounts on the same lines as payments are at present made by the Finance Department of the Ministry in London. Charge Against Military
Sergeant
