

Incentive to Tillage

AN ANNOUNCEMENT of more than ordinary interest and importance to Irish farmers has just been made by the Department of Agriculture.

The War Office authorities have been anxious to secure an extra supply of oats for this country for the purposes of the

Army in the coming year, and they have been for some time engaged in conference with the first-mentioned body with a view to deviating a means calculated to attain the desired object.

The result of the interchange of views and suggestions on the matter is a definite understanding that should lead to a considerable extension of the tillage of Ireland during the coming season. The War Office will buy oats grown in this country in 1917 in excess of the quantity grown in 1917 at a stipulated minimum price. For white oats of quality to Army standard, £3 per ton will be paid and for black oats, £2 10s per ton, so that if these prices or even higher ones rule next year the general rate can still, on the other hand, prove a good basis for the market.

We believe that the Irish Volunteers, by sending general subscriptions to the department of the Irish Volunteers numbered or otherwise as it stands, will be able to meet these requirements.
