MAN WHO DID NOT APPEAR CORPORATION REFERENCE

A bench warrant for the arrest of John Meehan, Ballyallinan South, Rathkeale, was issued from Rathkeale District Court on Monday last by Justice C. S. Kenny, B.L.

Meehan was charged, on summons, with the larceny of a bicycle lamp, the property of Maurice Hayes.
