WAS MOTHER-GENERAL FOR YEARS

Rev. Mother Alphonsus Brazil, whose death took place at the Brigidine Convent, Mountrath, was born in St. Louis, U.S.A. in 1861, and coming to Ireland at an early age, lived with relatives at Kilfinane, Co. Limerick. She received her early education at the Convent, Mountrath, and entered the Order, being professed in 1888. Having occupied every position of importance in the Order, she was appointed Mother-General in 1926, and held the position for twelve years. With the exception of her term as Mother-General, all the years of her religious life were spent in the Convent at Mountrath, where her excellence as a teacher was very evident. The funeral took place to the Convent Cemetery, following Office and Requiem Mass in St. Fintan's Church.
