Maoist Movement in Limerick

PEOPLE IN ALL WALKS OF LIFE in Limerick were shocked by the weekend report that a Limerick branch of the Irish Revolutionary Movement had opened a bookshop in the city. It is to be known as "Progress Books" and will act as a sales centre for books, pamphlets and leaflets. This is the Maoist movement which may well be regarded as a threat to the peace of this nation—a fact which can be realised too clearly if one is to read some of the publicity material on distribution throughout this city. The people of Limerick must wake up to the threat that is connected with such a movement out of the area before serious damage is done to the community as a whole.

WE HAVE REASON TO BELIEVE that far too many of our intelligent people are looking upon it as has been a silent invasion as something of a big joke. Let there be no misunderstanding where this matter is concerned—IT IS NO JOKE—and this important fact must be appreciated by all those in authority before it is too late. Some of us have seen the damage done in other countries by radicals of this kind and the sooner they are driven out of Limerick the better for the good of the community. We have seen members of this "way-out" collection of young people selling their revolutionary documents on the streets, in the shops and even in the publichouses. We have seen far too many people buy them and particularly our young people who will be quick to point out that they did so mainly out of sheer curiosity. From our observations and from the cliches now becoming common in this city, it would appear that more than a passing interest is being taken in these documents.

ONE OF THE MOST SERIOUS ASPECTS of the new menace is the fact that the Maoist movement is taking a firm grip within some of our schools and colleges. It is sad to find that too many of those in authority are not inclined to take this infiltration seriously. The same can be said of many an industrialist in the area but we want to make it perfectly clear that they would be well advised to take this as a warning. They are faced with a serious challenge and the sooner that that challenge is taken up the better for the future of this little country of ours. It is our hope that our clergy will step forward and condemn what is going on. It would appear that they are afraid to come out into the open and we have good reason to wonder why. Every priest has a duty to warn his people of what is staring them in the face. The Maoist movement is permitted to take a grip on our community life. They should do it now.

WE SAY THAT THE Irish Revolutionary Youth Movement must be crushed in Limerick and they must be run out of this city without delay. We have no place in our midst for those who preach the gospel of Red China and we have no place for the radicals who roam this city doing their utmost to disrupt everything within their power. We should not forget that what the Maoists advocate is nothing more than the dream of fools. Have we forgotten the slaughter of the slave labour that is so much a part of life in China? We must not forget it and we must stand firm against those who seek an Irish revolution in the name of Mao. We call on everyone and particularly the clergy and the trade unions of Limerick to rise up and unite to crush the menace that is threatening the life of this city today. The warning must be heeded immediately. There is too much at stake and the people of Limerick dare not lose the heritage their fathers so dearly won.
