City Milk Market project plans are European leader

PLANS to refurbish the Cresent and the Milk Market were among the best 40 in Europe out of a total of 959.

Both sets of plans are featured in a European architectural heritage exhibition, showing in City Hall. Limerick is the sixth stage on the tour of this photographic and audiovisual exhibition which has already visited France, Italy, Greece, Poland and London.

The main purpose of the exhibition is to raise awareness amongst a wide public, including national, regional and local administrations, educational institutions as well as architects themselves of the cultural, social and economic importance of the conservation,

enhancement and promotion of Europe's architectural heritage and contemporary built environment.

A total of 959 projects were submitted from all all over Europe.

Forty four pilot projects were selected from that total and of these two were awarded to Limerick.

The exhibition which is being hosted by the Limerick Market Trustees runs at City Hall to December 23.
