AFTER 31 nomadic years, Limerick FC can at long last call the Markets Field home once more when they welcome Drogheda United to the Garryowen venue this Friday June 5 (kick-off 7:45pm).

Having done the rounds in Hogan Park, Pike Rovers, Jackman Park and Thomond Park since vacating their spiritual home in 1984, the Super Blues finally have a venue to call their own, returning to the scene of their most illustrious period as a club.

Manager Martin Russell is among those relishing the Markets Field return, in particular the quality of the pitch, and he hopes that, after a troubled few months for Limerick, this landmark occasion can spark an upturn in fortunes.

"It's a very big step forward for the club to be able to get back into the Markets Field. It's something that hopefully the club can build on and it's something to be proud of in terms of the playing surface. At the moment it's as good as any in the country. Things like that are very positive and it's a step in the right direction.

"It's been a tough season and it will continue to be a challenge for everybody. You've got to work through tough times. Other clubs have done it and have come out the other end, while other clubs have had good days and have now fallen by the wayside. It doesn't stop; you have to keep working at it. Moving

back to the Markets Field is a big step forward for the club."

Russell emphasised, though, that Friday's grand opening is only scratching the surface of Limerick FC's capabilities, adding that the club seems to be better placed than most in Ireland to enjoy a sustainable long-term future.

"It was really important to firstly get into the Markets Field and now it's important to develop the Markets Field and continue to develop the team. There is a time frame on that; it won't happen immediately but everybody can help to work our way towards a better future.

"There's been a reliance on one individual to drive the club forward and, in a city like Limerick, I find that disappointing because I think that the rewards for the football team, and for the area, are there to be taken, but it needs as many steps forward as we can take. Getting back into the Markets Field is definitely one.

"For me it is a medium- to longterm project and any club should have a long-term plan, but I do think that Limerick, more than most, have a brighter future if it's done right. There's a lot of clubs who I don't think have a long-term plan and they may not know where they're going to be in one or two years' time."

On the field, Limerick's hopes of an FAI Cup run in 2015 were extinguished with a 1-3 defeat away to Bray Wanderers last Friday. Dean Clarke's 15th-minute equaliser was in vain after a second half double from Chris Lyons.
