VETERANS OF ATLANTIC AT SHANNON



Capt. H. E. Gray, President of Pan American Airways, flew into Shannon Airport this morning with three of the surviving members of the crew of the Yankee Clipper which made the first commercial crossing of the Atlantic in 1939. With him on arrival were Mr. J. McLeowd, who was co-pilot; Mr. Jim Richardson, flight engineer; and Mr. Stanley Zedalis, who was assistant flight engineer.

They are in Ireland to participate in the Silver Jubilee celebrations to mark Shannon's establishment. Commenting on Shannon's place in the world of commercial aviation, Capt. Gray said it was firmly established and, like Ireland's progressive march in the field

of industry, was earning a place of admiration for its remarkable development. NOTHING TO FEAR He did not think that Shannon would gain any special place in the Super-sonic age but there was no doubt that it would fit into the general pattern of developments. He did not think that Supersonic planes would fly as far as Shannon only to serve the European market through ferrying by conventional aircraft. This would not be a satisfactory arrangement from any point of view. He did not feel that Shannon had anything to fear in the future. It was attractive to American businessmen and to tourists who would want to fly into Shannon for all time.

RECORD PRICE PAID FOR LIMERICK SITE

A RECORD price of £5,000 an acre has been paid for a site in the Ennis Road area. It is the select Strand House site near the Intercontinental Hotel, the four acres of which has been purchased by Mr. Sean Hanley, B.E., for £20,000.

Mr. Hanley has already purchased some 25 acres of land during the past four years at an approximate cost of £45,000. The present site which was one time selected for the building of a new City Hall, is regarded as one of the most select in Limerick. The Strand House was formerly the residence of the late Stephen O'Mara.

Interviewed by a "Limerick Leader" reporter today, Mr. Hanley stated that he had not yet completed his plans for the development of the site, but he clearly indicated that it would be used for housing. "I will give further details in due course as to the number and type of houses which the builder will erect on the site," he concluded. The architects for the houses will be Messrs. Thomas S. McMahon and Co., Limerick.

Inquest on carpenter in Cement Ltd.

THE story of how 53-year-old Limerick carpenter, Mr. Thomas Lynch, Killonan, Ballysimon Road, lost his life when he fell 26 feet to the ground while working on a building construction at his place of employment—Cement Ltd., Castlemeungret, Co. Limerick, on August 12, was told at an inquest held by the Coroner for East Limerick, Dr. J. P. Clegg, in the Limerick Regional Hospital, yesterday.

A verdict in accordance with the medical evidence given by Dr. M. J. C. Furnell, Pathologist at the Regional Hospital, that death was due to brain damage and multiple fractures of the skull as a result of a fall, was returned at the inquest conducted by Supt. T. Griffin, Adair.

John Gavin, Carrig West, Clara, Co. Limerick, a scaffolder employed at Cement Ltd., stated in evidence that after returning from his lunch to the Mill House shortly after 1 p.m. on August 12, he heard a faint noise of planks falling as he descended the stairs of the Mill House. He looked down to the ground and saw two wooden planks under the partially con-
