THE Labour/Progressive Democrat pact is set to hold and elect

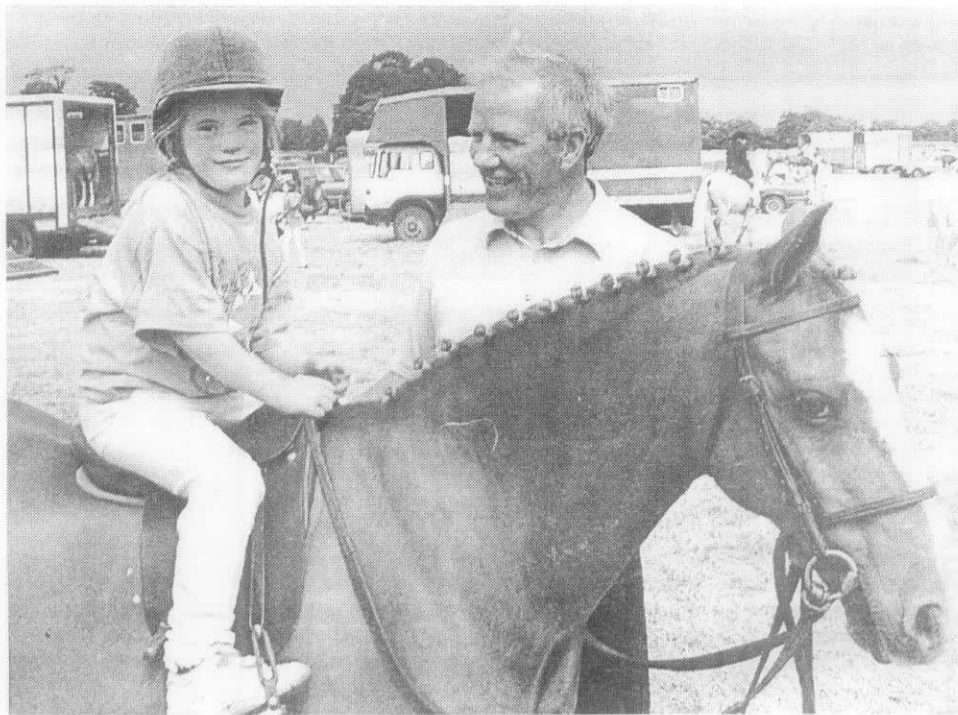
Alderman Sean Griffin Mayor of the city, when City Council meet to-night at 7.30.

The pact which includes nine votes - six Labour and three

Progressive Democrats forms the majority of the 17 member City Council.

The pact, formed following the election of the current Council has already elected Deputy Jim Kemmy, Cllr John Quinn, Senator Jan O'Sullivan and Cllr Dick Sadlier mayors of the city.

The pact was first for three years, and was further agreed for two years.

The four Fine Gael members of the Council, are meeting this evening and are likely to put forward one of their own members.

"That could be any of their four," according to a source close to the party.

Alderman Sean Griffin, aged 55, of Hyde Road, Prospect, was first elected to the council at the last local elections in 1989.

He stood for the Workers

Party, in the previous election in Ward three, but was not successful.

Married with a 21 year old daughter Marie, Alderman Griffin is a member of Limerick Harbour Commissioners, and the Regional Authority.

Interested in sport, he is a

member of a number of organisations in his own area, including Prospect United soccer club.

Alderman Griffin told the Limerick Leader that he personally would like to see the office of major rotate for the remaining three years of the Council.
