Kemmy denies pressure claim

MAYOR Jim Kemmy has denied that any pressure was put on Alderman Sean Griffin to withdrew from his party's nomination for the mayoralty.

"Alderman Griffin declined the nomination for his own personal reasons. There was no pressure used. It was left up to Sean entirely," he said.

'I was proposing Alderman Griffin for mayor and had my speech prepared," he stated.
