DEPUTY PEADAR Clohessy became the first ever PD chairperson of the County Council this Friday afternoon. Next Monday, Cllr John Quinn will become the first

PD Mayor of Limerick. The historic double comes as a result of the Progressive Democrats having done deals with Fine Gael and Labour in the county,

and with Labour in the city.
In the county, Fianna Fáil
had held every chairmanship
from 1974 until last year.
In the last City Council,

Fianna Fáil and Fine Gael had a majority between them and shared the mayoralties.

The FG/PD/Lab agreement in the county stipulated that Fine Gael would take the first year (Cllr Jim Houlihan) and that the PDs would have the second (Peadar Clohessy). Nothing is agreed for the rest of the life of the Council, although it is expected that there will be two more FG chairper-
