Second Moyross payphone is being considered

MAYOR Frank Prendergast has been informed by Bord Telecom that they are keeping the situation regarding public telephones in Moyross under continuous review with the intention of installing a second payphone in a suitable sheltered location.

In line with a new policy to provide payphone facilities in certain sheltered locations, Bord Telecom approached two shops in Moyross to take phones.

One of the shops, Kennedy's, adjacent to Cosgrave Park accepted the phone. However, the use of this payphone has been quite slow, but they expect it to increase.

Bord Telecom had problems with continuous vandalism in the kiosk that was in Cosgrave Park.

Mayor Prendergast said that he was glad to see that Bord Telecom were making efforts to ensure public telephone for the area and hoped a second phone would be installed soon.

RETURN OF LIMERICK BROTHERS ON STAGE

MALACHY and Frank McCourt, two Limerick men originally from Schoolhouse Lane, who emigrated to New York, arrive back in Limerick to perform their show, "A Couple of Blaguards" in the Belltable from Monday, July 1 to Saturday, July 6 inclusive, nightly at 8.30 p.m.

The McCourt brothers perform an evening of song, sermon and story based on their experiences of growing up barefoot and Catholic in Limerick and emigrating to New York where, living by their wits, they did everything from smuggling gold to tending an aviary.

"A Couple of Blaguards" was first performed in 1977 at New York's Billy Munk Theatre. In an enthusiastic review in the Daily News, Malachy is described as amusing, witty, intelligent, outrageous and as opionated a boyo as ever was.

Presented in 1984 as a St. Patrick's week show at the Top of the Village Gate, "A Couple of Blaguards" toured to Syracuse, Philadelphia and Chicago. Originally booked in Chicago for two weeks the show was held over for seven months.

Malachy McCourt, who claims that he "talks for a living" made his Broadway debut in "Mass Appeal" as understudy to Milo O'Shea. His film credits range from "The Molly Maguires" to the soon-to-be-released "Brewster's Millions" with Richard Pryor.

Frank McCourt, who decided that his army position as a trainer of guard dogs was the perfect credential for becoming a schoolteacher, is now a highly regarded creative writing teacher at Stuyvesant High School.

THE monthly meeting of the ICA will be held as usual on the first Wednesday in July, at ACOT, Parnell Street.

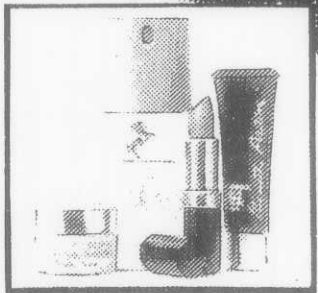
As this is the last meeting before the holidays, a large attendance is expected.
