## McCourt museum is to open in Leamy's school

A MUSEUM in memory of the late Frank McCourt is to open in his former school in Limerick city within the next month.

Artist Una Heaton, a friend of the late author. runs an art gallery in Leamy's building on Hartstonge Street, but is now planning to open a section dedicated to Limerick's only Pulitzer Prize winner.

Ms Heaton has gathered memorabilia relating to the late author, including a bicycle used in the filming of Angela's Ashes, among other props.

"It's all coming together now lovely. It's great to remember him and this will help keep Frank's memory alive. There was a lot of controversy about the book, but you can't positive and a good thing please everyone.
