

## ELECTION OF BAKER AT GLAN.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

At the meeting of the Glan School Board yesterday, the principal business was the election of baker.

Messrs O'Sullivan, Woods, Naughton, Barrett, Scanlan, and Moore, each in applications for the position at 27s 6d a week.

The Mayor, in proposing Mr O'Sullivan, said he was nominated by the Mechanics' Institute of Limerick, an association which had a record and a reputation equal to any other in this country, or any other country, and the amount of respect which it held in the city by the employers and the public is such that they should be proud of. When they had a man recommended by a society it was certainly a guarantee which no individual can presume to have, and he as an individual, is bound to sustain the reputation of the society. He regarded it as a great compliment to have to nominate such a man, and it afforded him the greatest possible pleasure in moving that Mr O'Sullivan be appointed. In coming there he is making a sacrifice, as the wages in Limerick are higher, and he (Mayor), as a master baker, can have no personal interest in furthering his election, as the more bakers in Limerick the less the wages would be.

Mr Ryan seconded.

Mr Kelly proposed Mr Barrett, who was a young man, who would be an honour to the place, and who had a thorough knowledge of the business.

Mr Barrett seconded.

Mr Hurley proposed Mr Naughton, who he said was a Nationalist when it was not fashionable to be one and looking around the room which contained many Nationalists, he felt sure that they would not forget him. The Mayor was the leader of the party in former times in which John Naughton was a member of the rank and file, and he spared neither time nor risk in spreading the light.

Mr Power seconded.

Messrs Woods and Scanlan were also proposed and seconded.

And on the first poll there voted for O'Sullivan—Messrs Dandon, Stritch, Lane, Madden, Ryan, and the Mayor, 6; for Barrett—Messrs Liston, Kelly, Sheaghnessy, Barrett, Trehy, 5; for Naughton—Messrs Hurley, and Power, 2; for Scanlan—Messrs O'Sullivan, Conway, Nolan, 3; for Woods—Messrs Galvin, White, and Mahony, 3; Naughton having fallen out, there voted for Sullivan, Messrs Dandon, Stritch, Lane, Madden, Ryan and the Mayor (6); for Barrett, Messrs Fitzgerald, Kelly, O'Shaughnessy, Hurley and Barrett (5); for Scanlan, Messrs O'Sullivan, Conway, Trehy and Nolan (4); for Woods, Messrs Galvin, White, and Mahony (3). Woods falling out, there voted for O'Sullivan, Messrs Dandon, Stritch, Lane, Ryan, Madden, Mahony and the Mayor (7); for Barrett, Messrs Fitzgerald, Galvin, Kelly Sheaghnessy, Hurley, White and Barrett (7); for Scanlan, Messrs O'Sullivan, Conway, Nolan and Trehy (4). Messrs Power and Liston did not vote. On the final poll there voted for O'Sullivan, Messrs Dandon, Stritch, Lane, Ryan, Madden, Mahony and the Mayor (7); for Barrett, Messrs Power, Barrett, Liston, Fitzgerald, Sheaghnessy, Hurley, Kelly, White, Trehy, Conway, Nolan, O'Sullivan and Galvin (13)

Mr Barrett was accordingly elected and returned thanks.
