THE VICTORIA DISASTER FUND.

So bitter is the feeling against the suspension of silver coinage that a secret organisation has come into existence in the Rocky Mountains called the Knights of the Silver Circle. The Knights threaten, in case the Sherman law is repealed, to compel Colarado to leave the American Union and unite with the Republic of Mexico, which is a silver coinage country. The Western States are honeycombed with secret societies, who are deliberating on the question of secession. Many of there societies are armed and organised, and, it is said, in the habit of holding monthly weetings for the purpose of drill. Arms and ammunition, it is hinted, have been collected in out of the way spotz, and the members have secret signs and passports to recognise one another in public.
