EDITOR'S NOTES ON THE LIMERICK VALUATION MILL BOOK:

The Limerick Mill Books (there are two) are very full of notes and comments made by the valuers and perhaps their masters. Some contain references to the fact that more than one valuation had taken place and there was a considerable amount of confusion within some records as a result of figures having been revised by different officers.

In the Limerick Books, as with others, one may observe and recognise the basics for the calculations which have been made. In the Limerick list some small pieces of calculation have been printed for scrutiny by any person curious about such detail.

Records for parishes Corncomohide and Bree differ on dimensions by different engineers. In the case of the mill No (10A), at Knockfenora there is a note which reads - "MRS CARROLL SAYS THERE WAS NO WORK DONE IN THIS CONCERN FOR A CONSIDERABLE TIME PAST, FEB/MAR 1851 MR JAS. DONNELLY NOW NOTED AS CARDING & TUCK MILL, REVALUED AT £2" showing a good saving on the earlier (1849) situation when Valuation total was £30.

It was noted also that there were cases in which valuation assessments seemed to have been the subject of quite an amount of discussion. If these remarks give the impression of uncertainty concerning the 'valuation' process this would be unfortunate. So in another section the actual details of the manner in which 'VAL.' was to be assessed are provided.
