Tributes to 'John The Man'

LIMERICK City Council last night paid tribute to a man who had "reached out to the entire community", the late John "The Man" Frawley, who was laid to rest that morning, at a huge funeral.

Chairman of the Cultural and Environmental Committee, Councillor Jack Bourke said that the late Mr Frawley had epitomised what community radio was about.

"And," he added, "if it wasn't for the John the Mans

of this country, what we were demanding wouldn't be as far down the road as it is to day."

Sympathy

Councillor Frank Prendergast who moved the vote of sympathy to Mr Frawley's family, said that he had given pleasure "to tens of thousands of people way beyond the confines of Limerick."

"Because of him," Councillor Prendergast said, "many people living alone felt that they were part of an extended

family."

He went on to mention his work for the underprivileged and dispossessed as a member of the Order of St John of God.

Councillor Win Harrington predicted that the late broadcaster would go down in radio history. "He had his own brand of radio. He was a local institution," she said.

Friend

Councillor Tim Leddin said that he had reached out to Limerick people of all ages

and Mayor Paddy Madden said that he would be sorely missed.

Councillor Jack Bourke described him as a longtime friend and "kindred spirit in show business". Tributes were also paid by Councillor Bobby Byrne.

Deputy Jim Kemmy recalled his political days and said, "When the history of broadcasting comes to be written, he will figure prominently in it."

"In his own way he was a genius", Deputy Kemmy said.
