THE Tanaiste Mary Harney married former Fairview Rangers goalkeeper Brian Geoghegan at a secret ceremony last Friday.

The hush-hush wedding took place at 4.30 at a registry office on Grand Canal Street in Dublin. The Tanaiste took time-out from her busy minis-

terial schedule to marry Mr Geoghegan before returning to her political duties. The Progressive Democrat leader had met with British Premier Tony Blair at the North/South Council meeting earlier on her wedding day.

Ms Harney was married in a lavender silk and silver beaded dress which was made by Limerick designer Simon

O'Mahony. Her ring, a diamond solitaire set in platinum, was also made in Limerick by jeweller and member of the PD national executive, Tadhg Kearney.

The couple celebrated their special day at a dinner for 20 guests in Moyglare County Manor House Hotel in Maynooth, County Kildare. The event was described as being "low-key" with the happy

couple smiling throughout the evening.

Mr Geoghegan, formerly from the Ballysimon Road, has enjoyed a successful business career, rising to the post of director of economic affairs, research and information with IBEC, since moving to Dublin in the 1960s. He currently holds a directorship of the Irish Business and Employer's
