7 Lt. Colonel Cox served in the Indian campaign of 1857-59, and acted as Staff Officer in the affair of Kudjivah on 1st Nov. 1857; served as a Brigade Major with Lord Clyde's force at the relief of the Residency of Lucknow (horse shot), and throughout the Indian Mutiny, and was present at the battle of Cawnpore and fight at Subadah Tank the same day, affair of Seraighat, action of Kala Nuddee, affair of Shumshabad, siege and capture of Lucknow, affair of Rayeah, and battle of Bareilly, capture of the fort of Muttoulie (six times mentioned in despatches, Brevets of Major and Lt. Colonel, Medal and two Clasps).

8 Major Dunbar has the Medal for the Punjab campaign. Served with the flank companies 98th Regt. in the force under Sir Colin Campbell at the forcing of the Kohat Pass in Feb. 1850. Served during the Indian campaign of 1857 from the outbreak on 12th May, including the battle of Budleekaserai, siege, storm, and capture of Delhi—wounded in the hand in the trenches on 12th Sept. (Medal and Clasp, and Brevet of Major).

1 Lieut. General Clerke served with the old 94th at Cadiz during the siege, in the Lines of Torres Vedras, during the retreat from Santarem; having been present in the actions of Pombal, Redinha, Condeixa, Foz d'Arouce, Sabugal, and Fuentes d'Onor. He joined the 77th Regt. (also in the Peninsula) on promotion, and served with it in the actions of El Bodon and Aldea de Ponte, at the siege and assault of Ciudad Rodrigo, siege of Badajoz, assault and capture of Fort Picurina, and storming of the castle of Badajoz (severely wounded in the right knee): he has received the War Medal with three Clasps. For the affair at Redinha he was promoted, and his services at Picurina and the storming of Badajoz were voluntary and were duly recognized by his superiors.

2 Colonel Ferryman commanded the 80th Regt. at the siege and fall of Sebastopol from 15th Dec. 1854, and attacks on the 18th June and 8th Sept. (Medal and Clasp, Knight of the Legion of Honor, 4th Class of the Medjidie, and Turkish Medal).

13 Captain Dyer served with the 17th Regt. at the siege and fall of Sebastopol from July 1855, and assault of the Redan on 8th September; was also at the bombardment and surrender of Kinbourn (Medal and Clasp, and Turkish Medal).
