They have been put to heavy expense in renovating the "Home," Reeves' Path, in which there are now 26 inmates—aged and infirm people. The Committee found it necessary to engage the services of a trained Nurse, who now acts as Matron of the "Home," and attends to the wants of the poor old, infirm inmates, who are unable to assist themselves.

Comfort, cleanliness, and health are closely looked after. This necessarily entails expense. Added to these are the outdoor cases. The Committee through their District Visitors, relieve the poverty of every poor Protestant in Limerick who requires it, and is a worthy object.

The coal distribution, which will be continued for the next six months, has commenced.

The Committee appeal with confidence to their friends for help to carry on the good work now much needed.
