MYSTERIOUS DEATH AT MITCHELS-TOWN.

A young man named Patrick Murphy, of Kil-beheny, Co. Limerick, was found in the streets of Mitchelstown last night in a dying condition. He expired on the way to hospital. It is supposed he was beaten by some persons who attended Mitchelstown fair on that day.

THE INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC.

The Press Association says it has been ascertained that at the Tower of London 180 soldiers have been incapacitated from duty at the one time from influenza. There are still 100 off duty.

Mrs Blundell, wife of Colonel Nicholas Blundell, Crosby Hall, near Liverpool, died last night from an attack of Russian influenza. Colonel Blundell is himself ill with it.

The Earl of Ranfurley has been suffering from influenza at Danganon Park, but has now recovered.

Returns at the Central Telegraph Office and the General Post Office to-day show a further diminution in the number of employees suffering from influenza. The London district offices also show a decrease.

SUDDEN DEATH OF MR PATRICK CUMIN.

The *Globe* this evening announces that Mr Patrick Cumin, Secretary of the Education Department was found dead in his bed this morning. He had suffered from renal and heart disease.
