His co-workers from the Limerick Clothing Factory (Taits) where worked until before 1969. became a full time musician, also came along to enjoy the 'trip down memory lane'.

Noel said that he wanted to thank all those who attended as well as the many more who phoned to congratulate him.

Noel formed his own band in 1959. In 1961 he made his first album and his first

radio broadcast was aired on the ESB sponsored programme on RTE. He was later involved in Club Ceili on RTE television in 1965. He was the winner of the Hohner Shield in the National Championships from 1963 to 1967, the only ceili band to ever achieve such success.

His success contin-

ued on through the 1970s, '80s and up to 1990 when the big band era ended. He specialises in ceili and old-time music and also played for a lot of ballroom dancing gigs later in his career.

And Noel said that he is not finished yet, so watch out for more Limerick music dates in the future.

that it has made alternative arrangements for all families who have been availing of respite care in St Camillus Hospital, while a ward is being refurbished.

The HSE has also contacted all of the families affected by the temporary closure of the hospi-

Welcoming what she described as the HSE's "quick and caring response", Labour deputy Jan O'Sullivan said that she was initially concerned that the closure of the ward for refurbishment would mean that families caring for a loved one a home might lose this regular respite care while the work was taking place.

"I brought this to the attention of the HSE and I am very pleased to be informed that they have made alternative arrangements," she said.

The ward refurbishment is expected to be completed by mid-June.
