

# Progress of trainees in Germany

A reporter has made enquiries as to the progress of any trainees, who have gone to Solingen, Western Germany, for later employment in the Limerick Railway Rathbane of Krups Engineering Ltd. 18 girls left from Limerick by train for Dublin on 1st August, 1963; 19 boys on 8th August; 18 girls and 2 boys on 14th August.

Mr. McCutcheon, representative of the Company, with his family also flew out with the trainees on 26th August, Irish secretary.

Employers have been very pleased with the progress made by them; in fact some have already earned, in a short period, bonus in addition to their basic pay, a very good augury for the future. Letters of the trainees have been written to their families and friends of the good conditions at the factory and the fact that Catholic workers shared with other trainees.

A five day week makes it possible for them to visit at intervals some of the interesting places within easy reach of Solingen. Many of them also are taking advantage of the opportunity to visit their most recent visit to Germany (9th and 10th inst.), under the direction of the proprietor, Robert Krups, called on by Neville, C.C., St. Munin, Director of the Limerick Welfare Bureau, and Father Neville to visit the trainees at Solingen in mid-August—both in the hostels and in the factory, a further indication of the anxiety of the promoters of the Company to do everything possible for the welfare of the trainees. Doctor Korner has arranged for the trainees to take a trip to Cologne with Mr. Neville, and then to return by steamer up the Rhine and then back by road to Solingen.

The Company have now decided to take a further 25 trainees to Germany and have arranged for them in the Limerick Rathbane. Arrangements are being made by Messrs. Coffey, & Co., 119, O'Connell Street, Limerick. There are still a number of places to be filled. Anyone interested should call at 119 O'Connell Street, Limerick, while very rapid progress is being made at Rathbane, where the factory is being prepared for the arrival of the trainees.
