Musical Cecilian Society's 90th anniversary, they will stage 42nd Street at the University Concert Hall for three nights from November 26.

Chairperson of the ecilian's, Niamh Cecilian's, Niamh Morrison O'Brien, said this will be one of their biggest productions to date and "definitely one of the most energetic."

"It really is a show within a show. It's going to be a very lively show, and a toe-tapping per-formance," said Ms O'Brien, adding that she hopes the Cecilian's will remain strong for another 90 years.

42nd Street is regarded as the quintessential 'backstage' musical, trac-ing the history of a Broadway musical comedy, from casting call to opening night.
It follows the story of

famed director Julian Marsh, who despite failing health is determined to stage one last great production.

It is perhaps the most famous of Warner's early 1930s Busby Berkeley musicals, and features musicals, and leatures musical set pieces includ-ing 'We're In The Money', 'Lullaby of Broadway', and 'Dames'. The Cecilian Musical

Society is the second oldest society in the country, formed in May 1919 by

the Jesuits in Limerick.
Over the past 90 years,
the society has highlighted and encouraged the acting ability of many stars, including one of Limerick's most famous sons, the late Richard Harris, the opera singer Suzanne Murphy, actor Liam O'Brien, and Amanda Minihan, who recently starred in The Producers in the West

Mr Boucher became a member of the society in 1968, and in the past 41 years he has been a part of some 30 of the society. of some 30 of the society's 140 productions.


The Cecilians drew huge crowds to the productions in the 60s, but thereafter the advent of the mass media threatened to take a slice of their market.

"With such a variety on offer now, you have to pick shows that appeal to audiences number one and make sure that your standards are of the highest.

It has to be up to mark to bring people in, and get them to get up and go out at night," said Mr Boucher.
