

Yehudi Menuhin And Philharmonia Arrive

Members of the Limerick Symphony Concerts Society were present at the Limerick railway terminus this afternoon when the London Philharmonia Company arrived for the concert at the Savoy Cinema to-night in which the world-famous violinist, Yehudi Menuhin will be the soloist.

The visitors were greeted by the Mayor (Ald. G. E. Russell), Mr. M. McGuire, Chairman of the Society, Mr. J. C. Duggan, Hon. Secretary, Mr. C. S. Stenson, B.E.

Contrary to expectation, neither Mr. Menuhin nor the conductor of to-night's concert, Mr. Efrem Gurtz, were on the train. They had been driven by road from Cork and arrived at their hotel earlier.

The 70 piece orchestra has been distributed throughout various city hotels, and this afternoon most of them availed of the fine sunny weather to make a tour of the city.

Although to-night's concert is not completely booked out, the response is highly satisfactory to the organising committee and patrons are expected from all parts of the surrounding counties.

The programme is Overture "Scala di Seta" by Rossini, Mendelssohn's Concerto in E Minor, the Beethoven Concerto in D and lastly the Overture "Egmont" by Beethoven.

Judging from the reception given to the ensemble in Cork last night the music lovers who patronise to-night's performance are due for a rare treat.
