LIMERICK band Hermitage Green are sitting at Number 3 in the Irish Charts this week with their debut studio album 'Save Our Soul'. The pop/folk quintet was held from the top spot by Adele's mega selling '25' and Dingle's Walking on Cars.

It is a stunning achievement for the band who emerged just five years ago from the backroom of The Curragower Bar to playing across continents to a loyal fanbase, from South Africa to New York, from Dubai to Dolan's on the Dock Road. The group took just six months to write and complete the new album with producer Philip Magee at The

Mill Recording Studios in Swords. Magee has worked with The Script, Kodaline and The Academic.

Now signed to Sony Music Ireland Hermitage Green have released a new video for their song 'Make It Better' made by Stoneface Films. It was filmed in the basement of Grangegorman College - formerly Richmond Insane Asylum for women.

### FILM Limerick win in Fresh


A SEVENTEEN year-old Limerick girl was awarded the title of Ireland's Young Filmmaker of the Year 2016 at the Fresh Film Festival. The award was presented to Rachel McGill who has been making and producing films for two years and sits her Leaving Certificate in June.

The Fresh Film Festival in existence since 1997 encourages young people to express themselves through film and in the 20 years of the film festival this is the first time that a young woman has won the title. Rachel's winning film 'Poppies' is inspired by Sylvia Plath's poem 'Poppies in July'. Commenting, Festival director

Tavne Foley says:

"Over the past 20 year of Fresh Film Festival, the young people of Ireland have consistently submitted high quality and visually beautiful films. This year we are once again impressed by the creativity and quality of these young filmmakers."
