local band profile | sutras

With a song in the final four of the Bacardi/Hotpress song of the year competition and having been voted as one of the top ten most promising groups in Hotpress, it's been real good in the hood for local band Sutras in recent weeks. The LEG caught up with band member Keith Forde for a cheeky chat about their beckoning success. des dockery does the talking......

LEG: Tell us a bit about you're new single 'Machine'. KF: We released a single last year called Princess, which got to number 19 in the charts and 'Machine' was actually one of the bsides on that. We just entered it for the song of the year competition without really intending to release it or anything, but now that it's down to the last four we might rethink that and do a radio release or something like that. We've just recorded a video for the song and have posted it off to 'No Disco' so hopefully you'll be able to see it on there soon. Along with that we've just done a thing with Fish on RTE and that's due to be aired next Friday, so we've been pretty busy.

LEG: That's cool; ye must be pretty pleased with the reaction to it all so?

KF: Yeah, we're delighted, it's been great. When the song got down to the last eight, the viewers on Tom Dunne's pet sounds voted and we got 73 percent of the vote. The final is next week so fingers crossed and we'll see what happens. If we win we get over ten and a half grand's worth of equipment so that'd be great

LEG: You're an independent band at present, is the main aim at the moment to get signed or are ye happy enough been on your own for the time being?

KF: Yeah, that's right, but we're actually playing a really important gig in Whelans in Dublin and there's gonna be a few record company people over from England, so we'll see what happens. The pressures gonna be on but we're confident.

LEG: What are the bands plans for the next year or so, is it world domination or what?

KF: Well I don't think we'll release 'Machine' as a single because it was a b-side already and that would be a bit of a sell out. So basically it's a lot of touring. We're gonna do an Irish tour and we're talking to some people about dates in England so there will probably be a few gigs over there aswell. We play Dolan's on April the 4th; we haven't played there in ages so that should be good. We'll probably be playing Witnness aswell so that will be a highlight.

LEG: Any plans for a new album or another single release soon? KF: We're doing demos all the time now for record companies and that, but we plan to release something properly before the summer. Hopefully this time though it will be through a record company, we'll see. Either way, it's all good.
