#### NEW RELEASES THERAPY? - " Lonely, Cryin' Only "

The return of Therapy? in the last two months, after a short break, has been low key to say the least. One of Ireland's most consistent performers of the nineties, they returned in March with a critically acclaimed album entitled 'Semi Detached', and this single is the second to be lifted from the aforementioned.

A change in line-up and a recuperation period after five year of constant work was meant to be the spur for Andy Cairns and the boys to re-launch themselves on the Irish music scene with a bang. Unfortunately it hasn't



really worked out that way and the new album and subsequent single have been and gone without to much attention been paid. This single will probably follow in its predecessors footsteps, but really it deserves more than that. 'Lonely, Cryin' Only' is typical Therapy?, fast, loud and brisk at just over two and a half minutes. The opening 15 seconds are innovative, a telephone ringing, and an answering machine telling us to " leave a message or leave me alone", leading into a Pixie-esque intro.

The rest is unmistakeable Therapy?, and their distinctive sound has perhaps hindered the progression in an age where bands are perceived as being unimaginitive if they release too singles that sound alike. However Therapy? are not really bothered about fame and fortune at this stage. They will continue to do what they are doing, and I'm sure their many fans will enjoy this record as much as their other releases. (7/10)


