the Catherine Street pub.

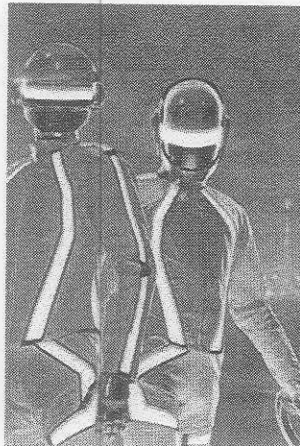
