It is by no means a comprehensive list but an overview. To get into all the genres of music in the city like blues, country, jazz, ambient, electronic, dance, post-rock, comedy and metal would require many more pages, such is the depth of talent in the city. Limerick can be proud of the achievements of its music creatives lately. Earlier this year Limerick band Windings were shortlisted for the Choice Music Prize for their album 'I Am Not The Crow'. It stood in a shortlist of 10 albums with 'Little Sparks' by Dublin band Delorentos eventually taking the honours.

Hermitage Green formed from informal acoustic music sessions in the back of Curragower Bar are now regularly selling out venues in Limerick and Dublin. They have toured as far as Australia and Abu Dhabi.

Senakah scored a big radio hit in 2012 with their catchy earworm 'Human Relations' and have just released a full album of the same name produced by Noel Hogan of The Cranberries.

Limerick band The Cranberries do not need any introduction with over 40million album sales worldwide in a career that began in the mid-'90s. The band reformed in 2010 and released the album 'Roses' in 2012 backed by an extensive and successful tour of Europe, and America.

Leading Armies are a relatively new band but have already played some high profile shows at Limerick Milk Market and recently came out on top at the Indie Week showcase to win the opportunity to perform at Indie Week in Toronto, Canada.

The Rubberbandits fell just short of scoring a Christmas No. I'with 'Horse Outside' and released a double album 'Serious About Men' in 2011 and along with many TV appearances made a comedy pilot for Channel 4.

Brad Pitt Light Orchestra released the wonderful album 'Lowering The Tone' in 2010 and are back in the studio again with new releases promised later this year. Protobaby won a local competition to perform at Bailystock Festival in Poland and got invited back the following year, released a strong debut 'The Spark' in 2012 and are now signed to Cork's FIFA Records.

Local record labels and music collectives have offered acts extra exposure notably, Out on a Limb Records and Macronite. Local recording studios at Bishop's Palace, Wav Mastering and Denis Allen Studios have given Limerick music its professional sheen.

Venues in Limerick have been responding to this creativity in the city and have opened their doors to original music as part of their entertainment offering with local artists launching singles and albums of new material. Dolan's is celebrating 15 years of live gigs and has consistently provided a platform in Limerick. Added to that newer venues such as Cobblestone Joe's on Ellen Street, The Library on Cornmarket Row, The Loft at Locke Bar, The Orchard, The Blind Pig and Ormston House are now well established. The high quality of bookings by Seoda Shows based at Bourke's Bar, including Sonic Youth's Thurston Moore, has also given the local supporting acts something special to crow about on their gigging biographies. Peter Delaney, who has just released his solo album, runs Wireless Folk, an occasional live acoustic folk night in the city.

# Damien Drea keeps the flame burning

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A DEBUT album is on the cards for Limerick artist dREA, the latest project of songwriter Damien Drea.

The album, which is due for release this coming autumn, is produced by Giuliano Baglioni, who has previously worked with U2 wingman Daniel Lanois.

The recording process has been an extensive one for dREA, as Damien explains.

"It's taken nearly two years from start to finish between writing, production and changing things around. We'd have gone back to the drawing board a few times and then our producer was coming over and back from Canada."

Damien has played at venues in all corners of the world and has kept the musical flame burning in his family, with both of his parents being professional musicians.

dREA have a tour planned for later in the year after their debut album is released, with the band expected to play in countries such as United Kingdom, Germany and Canada, and they also released an EP called 'Hunting'.

Damien believes that the prominence of social media makes it far easier for musicians like dREA to get their music into the public domain. "It definitely helps. I haven't put any music videos online yet but I have uploaded my music onto Soundcloud.

"We released a three-track acoustic version of our recent EP and that was filmed as well so that might be the first video we put up on YouTube."

With the music industry now heavily geared towards producing digital copy for downloading, the days of the CD appear to be numbered.

Damien acknowledges the importance of embracing the concept of downloads, but he still holds considerable affection for the compact disc and its tangible qualities.

"I've always liked to have a record in my hand to see things like where it was recorded and who was involved in it.

"I've sold quite a few CDs but people seem to be going for downloads nowadays and that certainly seems to be the way it's going. With HMV closing it's hard to get a CD now in Limerick."



## Peter Delaney and the witch's bottle

PETER Delaney (33) is on a journey that began in his bedroom and has led him to his current tour in which he is promoting his new album 'The Witch's Bottle'.

From writing to recording, Peter likes to do his creative work at home, using recording software, a small mixing desk and a couple of mikes.

"It's much more relaxed that way. I can take my time in getting the result I want. The downside of that is that without the clock ticking, you can procrastinate so it can take a long time to produce a recording".

Signed to Limerick-based Out On A Limb Records, Peter launched his album with a gig in Dolan's last week and will be heading next for Cork and Dublin to promote the CD.

Until now, the singer/ songwriter has been organising his own tours and bookings, "which is not so hard for a sole performer. Trying to do that for a band is a lot harder".

A native of Raheen, now living in Ballyneety,

Peter draws inspiration from traditional songs and old folk music as well as the lilting melancholy of vintage Hawaiian recordings.

In 2007 Peter self-released his debut mini album 'Duck Egg Blue', which was re-released through Deadslackstring Records in 2011. He brought out a limited live CD through Apolloaan Recordings in 2010.

He has joined both Oscar winners, The Swell Season, and Fionn Regan as support act on the Irish leg of European tours. He was invited by Donal Dineen to play the main Body and Soul stage at Electric Picnic, and in 2009 he played the VPRO Dwars festival in Amsterdam.

Peter has toured extensively but he believes the type of venue where gigs are held is changing. "There's a lot of new venues opening up. I've played in the Franciscan church, a gallery and the audiences tend to be different, more attentive than people in the pub".

Peter is also a member of the band Red Eskimo and runs Wireless Folk, a live acoustic folk night in Limerick. And as if that wasn't enough, he also makes short films, experimental films and music videos.
