The Hitchers reunite for Quinn's 'Recess'



Limerick band The Hitchers reform to celebrate Theme Tune Boy's new single release this Sunday October 27

LIMERICK band Theme Tune Boy launch their new video 'Recess' featuring dozens of brave Limerick citizens who lent their lip syncing skills at the recent video shoot at The Music Hub.

Theme Tune Boy is the most recent incarnation of Niall Quinn (drummer/songwriter with The Hitchers). TTB's debut album The Return of the Living Dead was released in Spring 2013 to great reviews. The band will play a full set and record another video on the night before making way for 90's punk rockers The Hitchers who have come together for the night to do their first show in five years.

The Hitchers released two albums and a slew of singles/ EPs in the late '90s. The Limerick band came to the attention of legendary BBC DJ John Peel who championed the bands debut UK release 'It's All Fun and


Games 'Til Someone Loses An Eye'. The 'Strachan/ You Can Only Love Someone' double A-side single featured in Peel's Festive 50 songs of 1997.

Though The Hitchers officially de-mobbed in 2001 they have occasionally reformed for one-off shows and media interest in the band is rekindled pretty much biennially around the time of World Cups and European Championships, which recently led to The Guardian readers voting their song 'Strachan', dedicated to the current Scotland manager, "the greatest football song ever".

New music and tour from James Vincent McMorrow



JAMES Vincent McMorrow has announced a release date for his new album and a gig in Limerick. The opening track from his new album is streaming now on www.musiclimerick.com. The song 'Cavalier' off his new album 'Post Tropical' sees McMorrow ditch the guitar for a James Blake-style sparse sound track. It is a stunning piece that will raise expectations for the artist's Limerick show.

The critically acclaimed debut album 'Early in the Morning' from James Vincent McMorrow reached number 1, went platinum and picked up a Choice Music Prize nomination upon its release in 2010. The follow up album 'Post Tropical' will be released in January. The new record will herald a change in musical direction for the songwriter who revealed, "I'm so proud of 'Early in the Morning' but I never longed to be a guy with a guitar. You play these songs live as best you can, and suddenly you're a folk musician. But the texture of this new record is completely different. This is the kind of stuff that makes sense to me." James Vincent McMorrow will play University Concert Hall, Limerick on Saturday February 1.

FORMED in 1990 The Would Be's debut single 'I'm Hardly Ever Wrong' caught the attention of BBC Radio One's John Peel. Stephen Street produced their EP 'Silly Songs For Cynical People'. The band garnered a number of Singles of the Week awards in NME and the band supported Morrissey on his 'Kill Uncle' tour. The young band lasted only two years as their indie record label lacked the funds to support them.

The Would Be's reformed in 2012 have released two wonderful singles and their long awaited album 'Beautiful Mess' is out now. The Would Be's play on Wednesday October 30 at Cobblestone Joe's.
