Limerick band prepare to Go places with release of new EP

WE are always on the lookout for new bands emerging from the bustling Limerick music scene, and one to come across our radar in recent times is four-piece Going 90.

Described as akin to something like Two Door Cinema Club and The Editors "being involved in a fender bender", the fledgling outfit were formed in late 2012 by brothers Niall and Ollie Phillips, quickly followed by Marty Ryan and Andrew Franks.

They have already played support to Fight Like Apes, The Riptide Movement and The Cast of Cheers and released debut EP Quick Sale in June 2013 after, impressively, building their own recording studio and self-producing the record.

In January of this year Going 90 decamped to Manor Park Studios in Belfast to record single Kings Among Men with
