Senakah launch 'Human Relations'

LIMERICK's Senakah (formerly Seneca*) recently completed the new album called 'Human Relations' which was recorded with Noel Hogan of the Cranberries on production duties. The album follows 2008's critically acclaimed debut 'Sweeter Than Bourbon'.

Senakah has produced a video for the first single to be lifted from the record which is the title track of the album and will be available on iTunes from this Friday. 'Human Relations' is a strong indie/pop single and has rightly received plenty of airplay and now the band is ready to go out on the road to kick off the campaign for the album and will play Dolan's Warehouse this Friday February 17. Senakah's guitarist Brendan O'Gorman told Limerick Post this week, "We are absolutely thrilled to bits! Radio support has been great with both local and national stations giving us regular airplay and we are very grateful for that. Today FM have been playing it daily and Rick O Sheaof 2FM has just made it his 'Single of The Week'."

The video was written by, and stars, actor/comedian Ben Morrison and was filmed on location in Limerick in Dolans Warehouse and the boardroom

and office scenes were filmed right here at Limerick Post.

Just how important is having a good video for a band's singles now that social media allows fans to re-post favourite videos. Brendan says, "A video certainly helps a lot, it gets people's attention and can help bring the song to a wider audience. From extensive touring over the past few years we've built up a large fan base both in the US and Ireland and some European countries. The social media aspect really helps to get your music straight to them and in turn allows them to share it with their own friends and though the hits for our video are not in the millions our YouTube stats show the video been viewed in 90 countries."

Senakah's new album will be released later this year, also called 'Human Relations'. The album was produced by Noel Hogan of The Cranberies. It was a mutually beneficial experience according to Brendan. "You have to be able to put your trust in a producer as you give them a lot of creative control over your music so working with Noel was fantastic. It's great to have someone with that much experience and ability. Noel also has great natural instinct
