The Limerick politician was in Budapest this Friday at a Liberal Party conference and will fly home on Sunday where he is expected to talk the matter over with his wife Pat before any official announcement is made.

While the race for the four European seats in the Munster constituency is very open, it would come as big surprise if Mr O'Malley was not elected.

If he does run, it would of course cause big problems for the PD's in the next General Election.

Asked if there was any chance that Pat Cox would change constituencies to Limerick East in such an eventuality, Mr Byrnes replied: "I don't see it arising at all."

There would of course be plenty of willing souls ready to answer the call from the party to run in the constituency.

However, Mr Cox would surely be the only person able to get a sufficient vote in Limerick for the PD's to hold their two seats.

The whole scenario has yet to unfold. One thing that has come out of it, however, is many members in Limerick East feel that Mary Harney has handled the whole affair—particu-larly in relation to Pat Cox-very badly.

The former University of Limerick lecturer was anxious to stay on in Europe, but Ms Harney insisted in public and before consulting him that she would prefer Des O'Malley to run for

Progressive Democrats Europe and for the younger Cox to stay with the party in the Dail.
