## AFTER MANY DAYS.

Richard J. Staepole, of Ennis, had Thomas Fitzgerald, of Tullaher, summoned at Kilkee Petty Sessions as follows:—"Possession of part of the lands of Tullaher with the appurtenance held from complainant as caretaker under the provisions of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1887." Mr. Killeen, solicitor, argued for the tenant and gave satisfactory evidence that the landlord accepted a half-year's rent, giving a receipt for same in 1904, when Fitzgerald was supposed to a caretaker. The ejectment decree on which Mr. Cullinan was proceeding, had been obtained for rent due in 1902. The magistrates were unanimous in dismissing the case without prejudice.

## DEATH OF MRS. C. QUAIDE.

The death occurred on Saturday of Mrs. Quaide, wife of Mr. C. Quaide, of the firm of Messrs. Matterson, Ltd., at her residence, Edward street, after a short illness. The deceased lady, who had been married but a comparatively short number of years, was of a pleasant disposition, and her untimely demise is regretted by a large circle of friends, and particularly by a young family, to whom her death is an irreparable loss. The funeral took place from St. Michael's Church yesterday morning for Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery, and was largely attended.
