Objectors 'no' €250,000

A LIMERICK architect has refused €250,000 from the developers of the Opera Centre to withdraw her objection to the €250m development.

Two of the three other objectors have also withdrawn but are also believed not to have accepted the payoff from Belfast businessman Suneil Sharma's com-Regeneration pany

Developments Ltd.

Mr Sharma told the Limerick Leader that they are not denying the offer to

objectors but adds that the timing of the leak was quite cynical. "Everything was above board. We are perfectly content with what we did. It certainly wasn't a case of brown envelopes being passed around. We have conducted our business properly and with the highest degree of integrity and honesty. We don't have any qualms about how we conducted this," said Mr Sharma. Architect Cáit

Cheallacháin is believed to be pursuing her case with An Bord Pleanala on the grounds that architectural heritage will be lost if the development is approved by the planning body this Thursday.

However, a number of local heritage bodies and Limerick City Council have backed the project.

"Every major heritage body in Limerick supports us, from Taisce to Limerick Civic Trust. We have talked to everyone over the past four years," said Mr Sharma.

He added the project is the biggest development in the country at present and is set to bring 1,200 new jobs to the

region.

Leonard Denis Limerick Civic Trust and the Irish Georgian Society told the Limerick Leader

earlier this month: "if we lose out on this development we're looking at very serious problems for the devel-

opment of the area." Mr Leonard said that if the development goes ahead, the best of the old architecture on this part of the city

will be saved.

Man stabbed


