**DEATH OF MR R P POWER, JP.**—The citizens  
 of Limerick will hear with regret of the death of  
 Mr R P Power, JP, which sad event took place  
 to-day at his residence, Lower Mallow-st, after a  
 short illness. The deceased gentleman was for  
 over 25 years a member of the Harbour Board,  
 and with few exceptions was one of the oldest of  
 our public men. As a member of the Harbour  
 Board, he took a deep interest in all questions
