

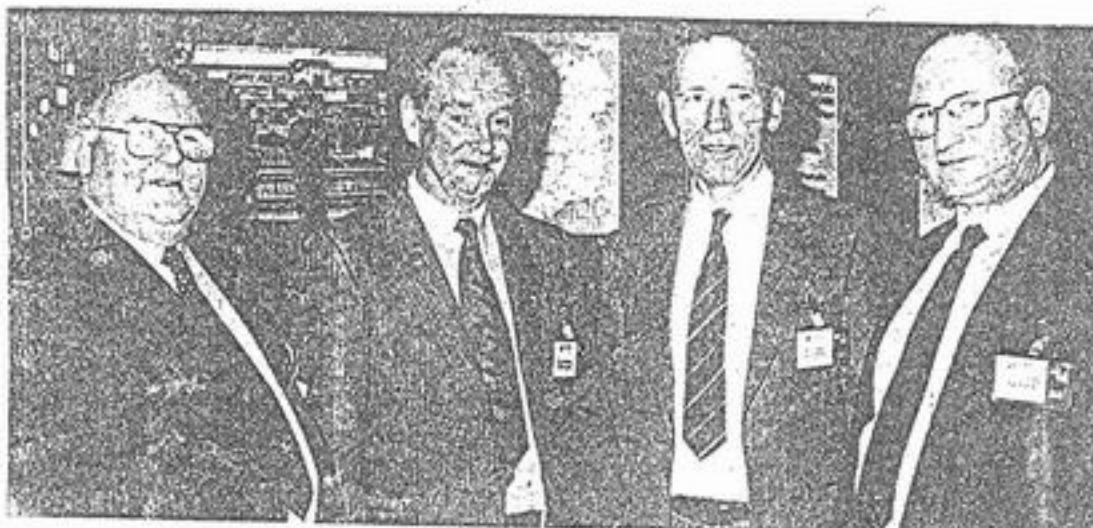
Limerick included in new freight service

IARNROD Eireann has included Limerick in a new and improved overnight nationwide freight distribution service called "Railink," with next day delivery between major centres and a guaranteed 48 hour service to all other areas.

Railink is a combination of Iarnrod Eireann's strength in rail trunking coupled with the expertise of local Road Haulage Companies who perform collection and delivery services to and from 13 depots strategically located throughout the country at: Ballina, Belfast, Cork, Dublin, Dundalk, Galway, Limerick, Longford, Newbridge, Sligo, Stranorlar, Tralee and Waterford.

The new Railink service is dedicated to and specialises in the distribution of parcels, wheeled cage pallets or wooden pallet loads and groupage, for example packages, cartons, drums or bales.

Freight or Railink travels overnight on dedicated freight trains between Dublin and the provinces in both directions from where delivery is effected outwards in loaded delivery vehicles. Inter-depot trains also operate between Limer-

ick, Cork and Waterford and these provide an efficient cross-radial service to Munster based industry.

The service operates on a 24-hour basis between Limerick and Dublin, Cork and Waterford depots with a guaranteed 48-hour service to all other areas including Northern Ireland.

A daily Monday to Friday collection and delivery service is provided with scheduled collection times arranged.

The cost of the new service is very competitive and can be tailored to meet individual require-

ments. Rates are particularly attractive for regular volume customers.

Additional services provided by Railink include integrated warehousing and distribution systems operated for various companies, Cigarette Manufacturers, Tyre Distributors and Food Wholesalers among them.

These activities include storage, order picking and on-time delivery and are a unique feature offered by Iarnrod Eireann Distribution.

The Limerick depot area extends to Kilkee, Ennistymon, Birr, Roscrea, Urlingford, Cashel, Tipperary, Kilmallock, Rathluirc, Newcastle West and Tarbert.
