Like for 15 weeks, was accused yesterday of ignoring suggestions by Shannon Development and the IT&GWU which would end the deadlock.

Now, Mr. Michael O'Leary, Minister for Labour, has been asked to preside at a meeting between the company and the union.

Limerick City Councillor, Frank Prendergast, secretary of the 4,500-member Airport Branch, said that Mr. John Carroll, vice-president of the union, and Shannon Development had called the Callins Head Office in Dallas, Texas. They requested a meeting and put forward proposals for ending the dispute, but were ignored.

Mr. Prendergast said that the Labour Liaison Division of Shannon Development had made settlement proposals which were accepted by the strikers but rejected by the company.

The dispute is over the failure of the company to pay terms of the National Wage Agreement.

# PATRONS COMPLAIN ABOUT STRAUSS CONCERT

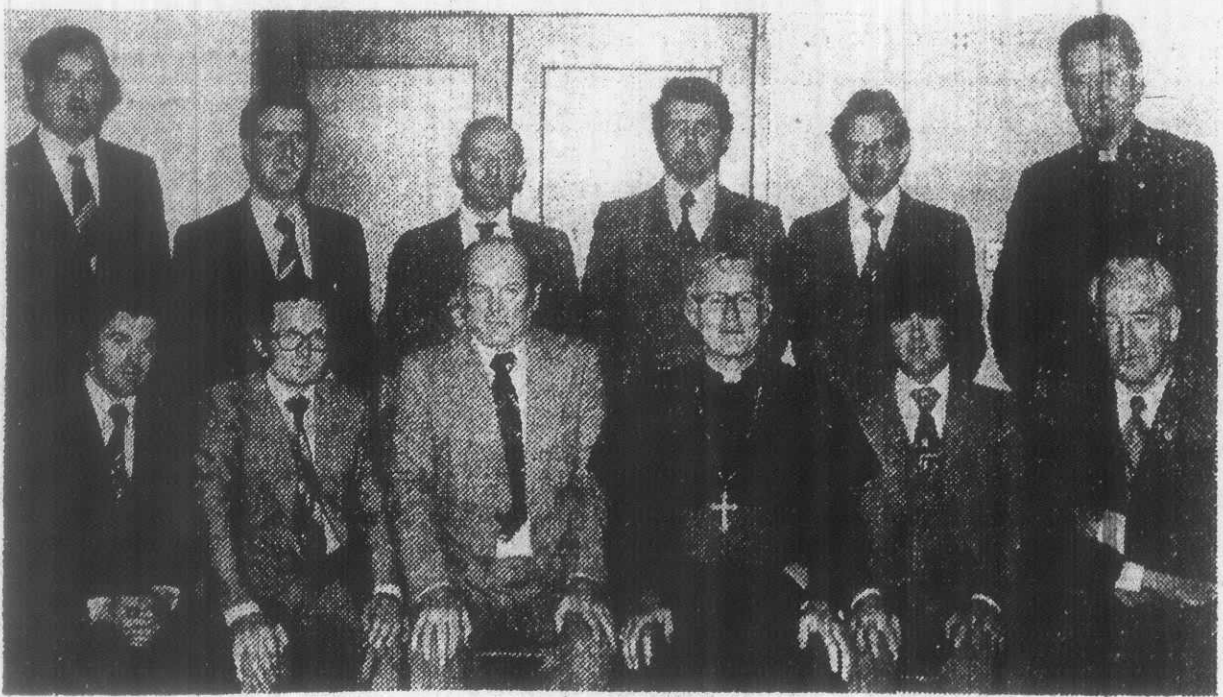
