## TELEVISION 25,000 demand multi-channel TV

AT a meeting of the Limerick Multi-Channel Television Campaign Committee, it was decided that immediate contact be made with the campaign committees of Cork, Galway and Waterford with a view to arranging a meeting with Dr Conor Cruise O'Brien, Minister for Posts and Telegraphs.

With reference to the Minister's statement regarding the government's authorisation for a transmitter which would serve for either re-broadcasting one

Northern Ireland channel or for a second RTE channel, the Limerick Committee warn that any effort to introduce a second RTE channel as an alternative to multichannel would be met with resistance throughout the country. The citizens of Limerick have signed a petition to this effect which already has over 25,000 signatures. It is understood that negotiations in progress between the BBC and the Irish and British departments of posts and telegraphs will take at least another 18 months before it is possible to re-broadcast one Northern Ireland channel.

# SHAMMON AIRPORT Barry opens new £180,000 oil jetty

THE Dernish oil jetty, which cost £180,000, was inaugurated today by the Minister for Transport and Power Peter Barry. The new jetty is unique as it is linked directly with refuelling services at Shannon Airport. The jetty is primarily intended to accommodate vessels of the 3,000 to 5,000-ton class, the type normally used in the fuel trade, but is designed to also handle vessels of up to 12,000, said Senator GE Russell in his address.

## BUSINESS Todds taken over by Switzers

ONE of the biggest business deals in the history of the city was finalised today when Switzers signed the takeover of Messrs William Todd & Co LTD, O'Connell Street, one of the biggest department stores in the south of Ireland. The deal means the transaction of 27,000 shares of the 40,000 held in Todds by the Buckley family in Cork. The entire transaction runs to £750,000 and a number of bidders had shown interest.
